# LETTER FROM GLOBAL PROJECT MANAGER

As we reflect on 2025, we do so with deep gratitude for the partnerships, dedication, and shared commitment that made this year's progress possible. Together with our local teams, community leaders, and government partners, Healthcare Without Borders and the Thaatkat Foundation continued to strengthen the foundation of the work established across Sierra Leone over the past decade.

Throughout 2025, our efforts focused on reinforcing sustainability, accountability, and long-term stewardship of the health and education facilities developed in partnership with the communities we serve. This year marked an important period of strengthening systems and preparing for the future through several key accomplishments:

- Hosted two impact visits, welcoming Kim Nabieu and Lloyd Foster to observe progress and engage directly with community stakeholders.
- Completed a comprehensive Performance Improvement Plan to enhance operational effectiveness and program oversight.
- Addressed critical infrastructure needs across facilities, including improvements to water wells, solar systems, and drainage infrastructure.
- Conducted repairs and maintenance at each health and education facility to ensure safe, functional environments for continued community use.
- Developed formal construction guidelines to support consistency, quality, and long-term durability of infrastructure projects.
- Completed an independent third-party audit, reinforcing our commitment to transparency and accountability.
- Established formal staffing agreements in collaboration with the District and Ministry of Education, strengthening local governance and ownership.
- Finalized a comprehensive Policies and Protocol Manual to guide ongoing operations and future facility management.

In total, \$38,699.35 was invested during 2025 to strengthen and sustain these initiatives.

The progress achieved throughout the year reflects the leadership, care, and integrity demonstrated by local teams and community partners who continue to serve their communities with dedication. Their efforts have ensured that the impact of this work extends beyond infrastructure, supporting systems that promote stability and long-term access to essential services.

As we move forward, 2026 represents a significant transition period. Building on the work completed in 2025, Healthcare Without Borders will focus on transferring stewardship of facilities to the District and Ministry of Education while supporting communities in assuming long-term responsibility for the resources developed together. This transition reflects a deliberate commitment to local ownership and sustainability, ensuring these schools and health centers continue to serve future generations.

We are deeply grateful to all partners and supporters who have contributed to this journey. The accomplishments of 2025 stand as a testament to the power of collaboration and shared purpose.














